As mentioned in my last message to the troops, during the April State Conference, there will be a Change of Command Ceremony during the Saturday night Banquet. With that, I would like to introduce Eric Olsen of the George Rogers Clark chapter. He will be the new Commander following the State Conference. Over the past six years, serving as the Washington State Color Guard Commander, we have weathered through COVID, hosting a National Congress, and increasing the number of events attended by the Color Guard and have reached several thousand students through our education outreach. We have seen Color Guard come and go, yet our numbers have increased. One of the points I need to make is that we need younger recruits as many who have served between 5-10 years are aging out of being able to march.

With the growth we have also taken the opportunity to recognize the service rendered by the Color Guard for the Washington State Society. When I started, there had only 1 Von Steuben medal awarded to Washington State. Today, we have 7 recipients of the Von Steuben, 28 have been awarded the Silver Color Guard Medal, and 36 awarded the Bronze. At each State Conference I reinstituted the years of service certificates.

Compatriots, I wish to thank you all for your service. I appreciate all of the sacrifices that you make for the purposes of promoting the ideals of the SAR. It cannot be said often enough, "We are the Face of the SAR".

Thank you for the journey, your support, guidance, persistence and comradery. We are about to embark on a period when our services will regularly be requested as we commemorate the 250th Anniversary of the Revolutionary War events. Thank you for allowing me to be your Commander and State representative over the last 6 years, serving 3 State Presidents. It has been an honor and I look forward to seeing you in the field. 22 Mar: WA State Patriotic Day (AKA Massing of the Colors). There was a great turn out for the event.


The CG won first place in the adult category.


