Washington State SAR President's Message – Winter - 2022 (1st Quarter)

Compatriots:

As we move into summer, many of the Chapters will go on hiatus. However, the business and service of the Washington Society continues. In just a few days, I will join a Zoom meeting of the National Trustees. The primary agenda item is the Museum and Education Center project. After seven years, the planning phase is now complete. The Trustees will be presented the



plans and budget for the anticipated three-year building phase. It is hoped the Museum will be ready for soft opening by January 2026 and full opening in time for the 250^{th} anniversary celebration on July 4^{th} .

In other National news, the Medals and Awards Committee and the Executive Committee have given final approval to the Medals and Awards Precedence project. Handbook V will be completely revised and will include a new medal precedence chart. It will also include a separate precedence chart for the ladies. When completed and released, please review the new Handbook volume as the medal precedence is now markedly different. In addition, the Meritorious Service medal is now stratified with bronze, silver, and gold versions to correspond with the awarding authority.

In this Marine Corps JROTC Unit, Cadet First Sergeant Kendra Murrell-Byrd received the SAR Outstanding Cadet Medal, certificate, and a check for \$1000.00 from the State Society.

We welcome Rodger Dent from the Alexander Hamilton Chapter as our new State Veterans Services Chairman. Please submit your new member veteran's information to Rodger for their Military or War Service Medals. Also, continue to track and submit Chapter and individual Stark points for service to veterans.



Guests have included the Washington State Superintendent of Education, state legislators, Clark County officials, judges, Battle Ground mayor, school board members, police chief and many more officials.



Flag Stuff

A Vexillologist is a person who studies and does research on Flags. A well-known vexillologist was asked what was the first flag of our country. He started doing research to find out. He researched documents and artifacts from 1775-1783 to find pictures of flags that flew during the Rev War. He found 39 variations of the 13-star flag. I have a copy of the report. I have 17 different 13-star flags in the Flag Museum in Spokane. I will post a different flag in the upcoming newsletters in no particular order. Here is the first one, **The Easton flag:**

This flag is consistent with the 1777 Flag Act that states the Flag will have 13 stars and 13 stripes. According to local legend, this flag was hoisted when the Declaration of Independence was publicly read in Easton Pennsylvania by Robert Levers on July 8, 1776, two days before a copy of the Declaration of Independence reached New York City.

The flag was used as a company flag under Captain Abraham Horn in the War of 1812. Some suspect that the design may only date to this era. The flag was given in 1821 to the Easton Public Library for safekeeping when the company returned. The Easton Public Library still holds this Flag.

Keith thanked the Fort Vancouver Chapter for their excellent work as host chapter of the Washington Society Annual State Membership this year, and looking forward, Keith commented on activities in flight to overhaul the WA SAR State website and improve our participation in Elementary School Youth Programs.

Minutes from the State BOD Meeting, 8 Apr 2022

The April 2022 meeting of the Sons of the American Revolution, Washington SAR Society Board of Directors, was convened at 2:00PM, Friday, April 8th, 2022, in-person at the Heathman Lodge in Vancouver, WA. A quorum was present with a total of sixteen voting Members, and thirteen additional non-voting attendees also in attendance.

Opening Ceremonies

WA SAR President Dr. Keith Weissinger called the meeting to order.

WA SAR Chaplain Edwin Dierdorff gave the Invocation.

WA SAR Vice President Greg Lucas led all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

WA SAR Treasurer and Alt. National Trustee Robert Sexton led the Compatriots in the Pledge to the SAR.

WA SAR Secretary Al Pinkham verified we had a quorum (need 7+ voting members).

Opening Remarks

WA SAR President Dr. Keith Weissinger welcomed all in attendance and extended a special greeting to NSSAR Secretary General C. Bruce Pickette who joined us at this BOD meeting. Keith deferred further comments in favor of getting started on our very full agenda.

Approval of previous WA SAR Society State BOD meeting minutes

WA SAR President Dr. Keith Weissinger asked if there were any additions or corrections needed for the minutes of the WA SAR BOD Meeting 29 January 2022 (online, via Zoom), and the minutes of the WA SAR BOD Email Voting 08-12 February 2022 (emailed proposals). Hearing none, a motion was made to accept both meeting minutes as written, which was seconded, and was approved by unanimous consent.

State Officer, Chapter President, and State Chairmen Reports:

WA SAR President Dr. Keith Weissinger noted there was no need to repeat information already submitted in written reports and requested all to please keep their comments brief.

State Officers:

- State President: WA SAR President Dr. Keith Weissinger deferred any additional comments.
- State Vice President: WA SAR Vice President Greg Lucas deferred any additional comments.
- State Secretary: WA SAR State Secretary Al Pinkham reported that he is increasingly challenged with mobility and physical health issues and introduced Assistant State Secretary Russ Oliver who will take over the meetings, minutes, and administrative duties. Al also reported that NSSAR is switching over to a new National Membership Database, referred to as the Blue DB. The existing membership database (Yellow DB) will be retired shortly, and Al encouraged all to extract any needed data from the Yellow DB just in case.
- State Treasurer: WA SAR Treasurer Robert Sexton noted that the state society is in sound financial condition and that he is currently testing an electronic payment method (Zelle) with NSSAR.
- State Registrar: WA SAR Registrar John Kraft noted that in his written report #2 the ACN number should be 102485, and in his written report attachment #4 the ACN number should be 102499.
- State Chaplain: WA SAR Chaplain Edwin Dierdorff reported he is working with Fort Vancouver chapter on a Compatriot Death Report.
- State Historian: new WA SAR Historian Neil Vernon is working to obtain and transfer the records from the previous Historian, Allen Wenzel, who resigned his membership in SAR.
- State Color Guard Commander: WA SAR Color Guard Commander Neil Vernon reported that the Color Guard is
 entering its active season, encouraged all BOD and Color Guard members to complete Youth Protection Training,
 and noted that Youth Protection Training could be done as a chapter meeting presentation to capture Compatriots
 who do not use computers.
- National Trustee: State National Trustee Viren Lemmer deferred any additional comments.
- Alt. National Trustee: State Alternate National Trustee Robert Sexton deferred any additional comments.
- At Large Director#1: State At Large Director Doug Nelson was not present at this meeting.

State Chairmen:

- America 250th Chairman Bruce Bock: was not present this meeting.
- Annual Conference Chairman Dick Paul: deferred any additional comments.
- Council of Chapter Presidents Chairman Greg Lucas: deferred any additional comments.
- Eagle Scouts Chairman Greg Emerson: was not present this meeting.
- Flag Recognition Chairman Russ Oliver: Russ reported on calendar year 2021 results with 8 of 10 chapters participating and distributed to all participating chapters their certificates of appreciation and OLD GLORY streamer pins. Fort Vancouver chapter came in first in volume of US Flag displays recognized (116, has now come in first place for the fourth year in a row). George Rogers Clark recognized their first US Flag display and earned their chapter OLD GLORY streamer. And WA SAR President Dr. Keith Weissinger set a new record for the number of US Flags personally recognized by a State President in a year (10)!
- History Teacher Award Chairman Greg Lucas: deferred any additional comments.
- JROTC/ROTC Chairman Conrad Plyler or Perry Taylor, Alan Mandigo: deferred any additional comments.
- Knight Essay Chairman Jeff Lightburn: Jeff noted a good Knight Essay season, with three chapters submitting
 essays for judging, and intends to expand participation next year.
- Medals and Awards Chairman Jim Lindley: Jim noted that only NSSAR can enter National Awards in member profiles and that he has downloaded 10 years of award histories from the Yellow DB before it goes offline. Historian Neil Vernon asked for a copy, and Jim encouraged Chapter Presidents to reach out to him for archives. Entering awards in the Blue DB is the responsibility of each chapter. Jim also reminded all present that the WA SAR Achievement Medal and the WA SAR Superior Service Medal can now be approved by the state or chapter President Keith has the medals, and funds to purchase them should be sent to Treasurer Rob.
- Membership and Chapter Support Chairman Mike Hutchins: Mike noted that he attempted a survey of dropped members half didn't respond the ones who responded mentioned a variety of issues leading to them not paying dues. He encouraged all present to combat these issues with extra communication during dues season don't let your members lapse from a simple lack of engagement. Work on the State website members page is going slowly and may have to wait for the new state website Mike will make use of the state newsletter to share information.
- Operation Ancestor Search Chairman Keith Weissinger: deferred any additional comments.
- Rumbaugh Oration Chairman Mark Shaffer: Mark noted that the effort to update the State website is in the building phase.
- Veterans' Services Chairman Kenneth Roberts: was not present this meeting.

Unfinished Business:

- Investment proposal: State Investment Manager Chuck Waid, State Treasurer Rob Sexton: Chuck reported that the state investment fund is healthy and in line with current macro market returns. Chuck submitted a written proposal, recommending changes to the WA SAR Administrative Procedures for section 9 (Investment Manager) see the file "WA SAR BOD April 2022 Meeting Proposal Investment Policy Change Proposal 2022-3-9.pdf".
 Compatriot Perry Taylor made a motion to implement the recommended changes as written, Compatriot Viren Lemmer seconded the motion, and the motion passed via unanimous consent. Assistant State Secretary Russ Oliver will implement the changes to the WA SAR Administrative Procedures text.
- Youth Video Contest proposal: Prior to the presentation and discussion, the Chair was turned over to VP Greg Lucas for the duration of this agenda item. State President Keith Weissinger submitted a written proposal, recommending WA SAR initiate a pilot program for a new Youth Video Contest see the file "WA SAR BOD April 2022 Meeting Proposal State Video Contest.pdf". Goal is to reach the modern young person where they are, on YouTube and Tik Tok, and encourage youth to curate a video with content relevant to the Revolution. There was extensive discussion of this proposal, ranging from consent of parents (will handle just like Knight Essay), storing the files (Historian), NSSAR input (which was to experiment with a pilot program), whether existing state insurance would cover the new risks (does not, will need a solution), how risks/issues over youth on video and copyright will

be handled (solve as part of the pilot), will chapters be burdened with yet another youth contest (chapter participation optional), and state budget impacts (modest addition to existing budget for youth contests).

After discussion concluded, three motions were made:

- 1) The Washington Society shall establish a youth contest to celebrate the visual arts by developing, conducting, and financially supporting the Youth Video Contest. Keith introduced the motion, Compatriot Mark Schaffer seconded, and the motion was approved by unanimous consent.
- 2) A State Youth Video Contest Committee be formed, with the State President appointing the Youth Video Contest Committee Chairman, subject to the Board of Directors approval, and all chapter chairmen of this contest being members of this Committee. Keith introduced the motion, Compatriot Mark Schaffer seconded, and the motion was approved by unanimous consent.
- o 3) The financial awards will be funded by the investment accounts in the same manner as the other youth contests. The state award amounts are as follows: First Place \$1000, Second Place \$500, and Third Place \$250, which is in parity with all other youth contest financial awards. Keith introduced the motion, Compatriot Mike Hutchins seconded, and the motion carried with the majority approving and one opposed. Assistant State Secretary Russ Oliver will implement the changes to the WA SAR Administrative Procedures text.
- YPT Streamer proposal: Chairman Perry Taylor: Perry submitted a written proposal, recommending a new streamer opportunity for chapters in WA SAR if the necessary chapter members complete Youth Protection Training see the file "WA SAR BOD April 2022 Meeting Proposal -YPT Streamer.pdf". Annual awards thereafter for sustained performance via an embroidered star for the streamer. During discussion, Compatriot John Kraft suggested that a chapter completing Youth Protection Training for 100% of its membership be recognized with a different colored embroidered star Perry agreed this was a great idea, and easily implemented. Compatriot John Kraft made a motion to implement the recommended changes as amended, Compatriot Neil Vernon seconded the amended motion, and the amended motion passed via unanimous consent. Assistant State Secretary Russ Oliver will implement the changes to the WA SAR Administrative Procedures text.
- State Website: State At Large Director#1 Doug Nelson: State President Keith mentioned that Doug was researching improvements to our state website and that our current state webmaster has resigned. The goal is to make the State website useful and easy to update Compatriot Mark Schaffer volunteered to lead a new committee to modernize the state website, and Compatriot Mike Hutchins agreed to help.
- State Strategic Planning Committee: Chairman Greg Lucas: Greg reported that the State Strategic Planning Committee is a new standing committee with monthly meetings starting in May 2022. Goals are to flesh out the strategic plan, which is missing budgets and timelines.
- State Education Committee Chairman Viren Lemmer: Viren reported he is working on a job description for this committee for the WA SAR Administrative Procedures. Viren is planning on connecting to all new members in the state, with new member training meetings two or three times a year via Zoom. Training will be much more than a packet and that SAR mentors and contacts will be critical for success.
- State Challenge Coin update State President Keith Weissinger: Keith reported that due to demand the BOD authorized an additional 150 of the new state challenge coins to be produced and Keith has them in hand here for the Annual State Meeting. See Keith if interested, \$6.25 each!

New Business:

- State Ethics Committee Models, Rules of Discipline National Vice Chairman Greg Lucas: Greg reported that he is
 on the NSSAR Ethics Committee and that a solution is needed for ethics issues raised at the chapter / state level.
 New models and rules are being discussed that provide best practices and templates for the chapters and states for
 disciplinary and ethics issues, with due process and decisions made at the most local level possible. There may be
 changes to NSSAR Bylaw #33 as a result. Stay tuned!
- Site of 2023 State Annual Conference Chairman Dick Paul: Dick reported the 2023 location has not yet been decided this is usually done 18 months in advance, and we are late (only 12 months remaining). Dick and Compatriot Jeff Lightburn agreed to re-up and plan the 2023 State Annual Conference. A proposal was put forward for Spokane #1 Chapter to host, with the location as the Mirabeau Park Hotel & Convention Center in Spokane Valley, WA, on 28-29 April 2023. Discussion focused on whether the Spokane #1 chapter had the resources ready to take this duty on (yes, with others volunteering to help), gas costs for the Western Washington majority of WA SAR members (potential for a SAR train, \$29 each way, make memories!), and that a different NSSAR attendee will be needed given the 28-29 April 2023 timing. Dick introduced the motion, Compatriot Al Pinkham seconded, and the motion passed via unanimous consent. Compatriot Chuck Wait asked if we should be planning 2024's location and timing, and this was postponed for the upcoming July 2022 WA SAR BOD meeting.

- Compatriot Fred Gilbert made a proposal for the WA SAR Society to fund the purchase of the Silver 250th Anniversary Medal set (\$45), the state-level award designed to encourage and recognize those compatriots to participate in local, state, national and international events which publicly educate, and recognize, honor, and celebrate the heroes of the American Revolution. During discussion, Compatriot Mike Hutchins jokingly asked if the state funding would apply retroactively to those who already paid themselves for their silver medal (No, and Mike was joking!). Fred made the motion, Compatriot Mark Schaffer seconded, and the motion passed via unanimous consent.
- WA CAR President, Luke Byrd, is turning 18 and wants to join SAR, and is a candidate for CAR Librarian General. Traditionally, WA SAR would endorse WA CAR candidates for national CAR roles. Compatriot Mark Schaffer made a motion that WA SAR endorse WA CAR President Luke Byrd for CAR Librarian General, Compatriot Jerry Bordelon seconded, and the motion passed via unanimous consent.



As most of you know George Washington was elected President by the people in 1789. The War ended in 1783, who ran the country? The War started in 1775 and George was elected head of the Army. Who did George report too? The answer is the forgotten presidents. There were 14. Of those 14 there is one person that everyone forgets. Who was he? What did he do?

Charles Thomson of Pennsylvania was the secretary from 1775 till 1789. He is considered the most important patriot of all never to occupy the Presidents chair, nor was he provided a mansion and carriage at public expense. But, as secretary of congress for his entire fifteen-year history.

Charles Thomson was the driving force behind the gavel and the living institutional history of the nation's first government. Without his prodding and pleading, Congress would never have survived. Without his faithful service, the record of the First American Republic would be lost to history.

His life was itself the perfect embodiment of the American Dream. He arrived on these shores as a penniless orphan at the age of ten and now, over two centuries later, he and his wife rest beneath a magnificent obelisk in historic Laurel Hill Cemetery in the heart of Philadelphia. Throughout his long and immensely productive career he left a unique mark on state and national government, natural science and biblical scholarship. His friends and correspondents of fifty years included Franklin and Jefferson.

It was Charles Thomson, the Secretary of Congress, who officially notified Washington of his election as the first President of the Second American Republic and accompanied him from Mount Vernon to the inaugural ceremonies in New York. He was also responsible for Great Seal's approval in 1782 and was one of the first men to sign the Declaration of Independence.

So many of us take for granite our chapter secretaries for all the work they do. They are the backbone of our organization. Well done, Gentlemen.




